Information on data collection by Landesbank Baden-Württemberg (LBBW) in accordance with Article 13 of the General Data Protection Regulation for the use of web conference tools with which LBBW processes personal data

Purpose for which personal data will be processed and legal basis:

In the context of using a web conference tool, personal data are processed for the purposes of invitation management, while using the tool, and possibly also while recording the web conference. The legal basis of the data processing for holding a web conference is based on a legitimate interest pursuant to Article 6 (1f) GDPR and, in the context of the employment relationship, pursuant to Section 26 (1) BDSG to ensure the functionality of the tool and the security of the web conference to be held. If a web conference is recorded using the tool, this is done only after consent has been granted pursuant to Article 6 (1a) GDPR.

If there is a legal obligation to record conversations, then the legal basis is Article 6 (1c) GDPR. The recordings of the conversations are not stored via or within the web conference tool.

Recipient or categories of recipients of the personal data:

LBBW uses contract data processors for the provision and use of a web conference tool. Personal data is not transmitted to third parties.

Controller's intent to transfer the personal data to a third country or international organization:

LBBW processes the personal data at locations in the EU/EEA. Transmission of personal data is not intended and takes place only if LBBW has approved this in advance and a sufficient level of data security is ensured.

Duration for which the personal data will be stored or, if this is not possible, the criteria for determining the duration:

LBBW stores personal data only for as long as the data is needed or it is required to do so on the basis of statutory retention periods. Web conference recordings are saved for seven days on the basis of granted consent and are then deleted.

If LBBW is required to store the data on the basis of statutory retention periods, then we store the data until the end of the retention period.

Data subject rights:

Every data subject has the right to receive information in accordance with Article 15 GDPR, the right to rectification in accordance with Article 16 GDPR, the right to erasure in accordance with Article 17 GDPR, the right to restrict processing in accordance with Article 18 GDPR and the right to data portability in accordance with Article 20 GDPR. The restrictions contained in Sections 34 and 35 of Bundesdatenschutzgesetz (BDSG – German Federal Data Protection Act) apply to the right to receive information and the right to erasure. In addition, data subjects have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority under Article 77 of the GDPR in conjunction with Section 19 of the BDSG.

If processing is based on Article 6 (1a) GDPR or Article 9 (2a) GDPR and there is a reference to the existence of the right to revoke consent at any time without affecting the legality of the processing up to the time consent is revoked:

There is a right to revoke the consent given to store the recording data with future effect at any time. After consent has been revoked, LBBW will no longer process the personal data of this data subject.

Information on whether the provision of personal data is a statutory or contractual requirement or a requirement necessary to enter into a contract, as well as whether the data subject is obliged to provide the personal data and of the possible consequences of failure to provide such data:

Individuals are neither legally nor contractually required to provide their personal data for LBBW, nor is this necessary to enter into a contract. If this data is not provided, it may not be possible to participate in or hold a web conference.

Information if processing is based on Article 6(1f) of the GDPR, the legitimate interests being pursued by the data controller or a third party are as follows:

LBBW processes the personal data, such as metadata, names, and e-mail addresses, in order to ensure the functionality of the web conference tool and the security of the data and conversations. The interests of the data subject are ensured in that only



as much data is collected as is actually required. There is no attention tracking. It is possible for the data subject to switch off his or her video image at any time during the web conference.

Information on the existence of automated decision-making, including profiling, in accordance with Article 22 (1) and (4) of the GDPR:

No automated decision-making or profiling takes place.

Information on your right to object under Article 21 of the GDPR

You have the right to object at any time, on grounds relating to your particular situation, to the processing of personal data concerning you that is based on Article 6 (1f) of the GDPR (data processing based on the consideration of interests).

If you object, we will no longer process your personal data, unless we demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing that override your interests, rights, and freedoms or the processing is used for the establishment, exercise, or defense of legal claims.
