

Data Protection Information

Information on data collection by Landesbank Baden-Württemberg (LBBW) under Art. 13 and Art. 14 of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) for contact persons of customers and business partners and individuals on whom LBBW stores data for the purpose of maintaining contact.

Purpose for which personal data is to be processed and the legal grounds:

We process your personal information for transacting, maintaining, or establishing relationships with customers, businesses, and associations and for maintaining (other) business contacts. The legal basis for processing is either consent given by you in accordance with Art. 6(1)(1a) of the GDPR or a legitimate interest of ours in accordance with Art. 6(1)(1f) of the GDPR.

Categories of personal data to be processed and their sources:

LBBW processes your name and your contact data (e.g. your e-mail address). In some instances, we also process your date of birth and your job position.

Your personal information is collected from you directly (for instance, when exchanging business cards) and through research in public sources such as newspaper articles, the Internet, and commercial registers.

Recipient or categories of recipients of the personal data:

LBBW does not share your personal information with third parties.

Data controller's intention to transfer the personal data to a third country or an international organization:

No such intention exists.

Duration for which the personal data will be stored, or, if this is not possible, the criteria for determining the duration:

The information will be stored for the duration of our customer or business relationship. Your personal information will be stored until you object to processing or withdraw your consent. If statutory retention periods require LBBW to store your data, we will do so until the retention period expires.

Every data subject has the right to receive information under Art. 15 of the GDPR, the right to rectification under Art. 16 of the GDPR, the right to erasure under Art. 17 of the GDPR, the right to restrict processing under Art. 18 of the GDPR, and the right to data portability under Art. 20 of the GDPR. In the case of the right to access of data and the right to erasure, the limitations set out in Sections 34 and 35 of the GDPR apply. In addition, data subjects also have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority under Art. 77 of the GDPR in conjunction with Section 19 of the Bundesdatenschutzgesetz (BDSG - German Federal Data Protection Act).

If the processing falls under Art. 6(1a) GDPR or Art. 9(2a) GDPR, you have the right to revoke your consent at any time. This will, however, not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out up to the time of revocation:

You may withdraw the consent you have given to storage of your information as a contact person at any time with effect for the future. Your right of withdrawal is valid even if the consent was granted before the GDPR entered into force.

Information on whether the provision of personal data is legally or contractually required or necessary to conclude a contract, and whether the data subject is obliged to provide the personal data and the possible consequences of a failure to provide such data:

You are neither legally nor contractually required to provide your personal data to LBBW. A failure to provide the information will result in our inability to guarantee business transactions or targeted communication. It will also make it difficult for us to establish future business relationships.
